31st International Conference of Indian Association of Palliative Care was organized by The Department of Palliative Medicine, The Gujarat Cancer & Research Institute, Ahmedabad. It had two components.

- 1. Pre-Conference Workshop on 08 Feb 2024, Thursday
- 2. Conference on 09, 10, 11 Feb 2024, from Friday to Sunday

Theme of the conference was "Revisiting The Domains of Palliative Care" which was aimed to address all components and Multi-Disciplinary Team of Palliative Care.

Pre-Conference Workshops

The Pre-conference workshops were planned to address focus group practicing Palliative Care. Six workshops were conducted and total 183 participants attended workshops.

- 1. CBT approaches in palliative care
- 2. Point of care USG in Palliative Care
- 3. Building Grief and Bereavement Programs
- 4. Extending the reach of Paediatric Palliative Care to improve the quality of life of children with life limiting conditions
- 5. Palliative Care Physiotherapy for Cancer Patients
- 6. Symptom Assessment and Management in Palliative Care: Empowering Nurses for optimal Patient Comfort

Conference

The two and a half day's conference had scientific sessions encasing the theme of the conference. It was planned in three halls plus two halls were exclusively for paper and poster presentations. Conference was started with plenary sessions by Dr.M.T.Bhatia, he gave glance regarding the advent of palliative care in Gujarat followed by plenary sessions of Dr.Pamela Sutton and Dr.M.R.Rajagopal

regarding WHO's initiative in palliative care expansion and positioning of palliative care into Indian health sector respectively. There were total six plenary sessions, by eminent International and National faculties on current status of education on palliative care, evolution of renal palliative care and multiple steps for effective leadership and its need in palliative care. The scientific programme covered the topics of clinical practice, nursing issues, psycho-social and spiritual aspects as well as role of complimentary therapy for palliative care. Sessions on Neuro Palliative Care, Paediatric Palliative Care and End Stage Renal Disease had exclusive exchange of knowledge and experience. Top leader (Directors and Superintendents) from various specialist and superspecialist institutes and head of various departments chaired these sessions. Session on Palliative Care in patients with drug abuse was chaired by Assistant commissioner from FDCA, Government of Gujarat. Very fruitful discussion, full of knowledge regarding NDPS act was done amongst panellists and delegates.

Gujarat Medical Council had given 07 Credit hours to the conference.
